PROCEDURES EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 1975 - CHAPTER XI

PROCEDURES presently in effect will be changed as follows:

1. Upon presentation of schedules of distribution for purposes of implementing orders on confirmation, such schedules are to be prepared and completed by counsel to the debtor, with or without assistance of accountants and such presentation to the clerk of this court is to be accompanied by a certification of counsel to the debtor and an officer of the debtor that in all respects the content of those schedules is in keeping with the claims on file in this court and the provisions of the plan. This court will compute court administration expenses as provided for by the Act.

Separate schedules are to be prepared as follows:

- a. Schedule of claims filed and allowed
- b. Schedule of claims under objection including those where objection is contemplated
- c. Claims scheduled but not filed at confirmation
- 2. Following entry of the order of confirmation, counsel to the debtor is to serve notice of the entry of such order in keeping with Rule 11-38(e) and is, within three days thereafter, to file with this court an affidavit of compliance with such Rule. This notice should further advise those creditors who were scheduled but who did not file claims of the 30 day provision of Section 355.
- 3. Following the expiration of the 30 day period contemplated by the statute, counsel to the debtor, with or without assistance of accountants, is to present a separate schedule of distribution of such Section 355 claims filed and allowed, and a separate schedule of distribution for claims filed and being objected to.
- 4. When all creditors have been accommodated under the plan and

and no payment or distribution remains, counsel to the debtor, with or without accounting help, is to recapitulate the total distributed to administration, priority and general claims and certify to such figures to this court.
