UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT

This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Qianyang Zhang (the "Applicant") for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access Fee Schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds, based upon the attached letter received on October 1, 2021, that the Applicant has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information.

Accordingly, the Applicant shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this Court to the extent such use is incurred in connection with the project described in the attached letter and application. The Applicant shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this Court.

Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- 1. This fee exemption applies only to the Applicant, and is valid only for the purposes stated above.
- 2. This fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this Court that are available through the PACER system;
- 3. By accepting this exemption, the Applicant agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption.
- 4. This exemption is valid from October 1, 2021 through October 31, 2023.

I am a PhD student in Economics at Columbia University. I am looking for a comprehensive dataset of retail companies bankruptcy fillings and results in the US for the purpose of economics research.

I want to study the spillover effects of retail bankruptcies (Chapter 7 liquidation and Chapter 11 reconstruction) on other existing competitor's and new entrants innovation activities and quality upgrading of products/services. I would also like to quantity the welfare gain/loss for consumers and other firms resulting from different types of retail bankruptcies.

Estimating whether the retail bankruptcies have positive or negative spillovers is an empirical question. To tackle the endegeneity concern of the decision to liquidate versus reorganize, I will follow the method by Bernstein et al. (2020) to use an instrumental approach that exploits the facts that the U.S. assigns cases to judges using a blind rotation system, which quasi-randomizes the assignment of similar companies to liquidation or reorganization. This empirical method will allow me to identify the causal effect of different forms of retail bankruptcies on incumbents and new entrants of the market.

Next, I would like to build a quantitative spatial model to estimate the welfare changes for consumers in different geographic areas, and investigate the implications of consumption inequality for different forms of retail bankruptcies.

My research results could be useful in several aspects. First, it would allow us to better understand the effects of retail bankruptcies on other firms in the industry. Second, it would enhance our understanding of the welfare consequences of retail bankruptcies for firms. Taken together, it would shed light on the effects of retail bankruptcies on firms and consumers. My research project is aimed at informing polies of how we could exploit retail bankruptcies to better improve the market efficiency while protecting consumer benefits.
