This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Kostas Pappas (the "Applicant") for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access Fee Schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds, based upon the attached letter received on October 4, 2004, that the Applicant has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information.

Accordingly, the Applicant shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this Court to the extent such use is incurred in connection with the project described in the attached letter and application. The Applicant shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this Court.

Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- 1. This fee exemption applies only to the Applicant, and is valid only for the purposes stated above.
- 2. This fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this Court that are available through the PACER system;
- 3. By accepting this exemption, the Applicant agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption.
- 4. This exemption is valid from October 7, 2024 through December 31, 2024.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.

The case information from PACER is crucial for our research in Accounting and Finance as it provides detailed data on legal proceedings such as bankruptcy filings. Accessing this data allows us to analyze corporate financial distress, governance, and the economic impact of court rulings. Our study uses textual analysis on court documents to extract key insights about corporate behavior during financial crises, contributing to the broader understanding of risk management and legal outcomes in finance. An exemption from the identified courts is necessary to facilitate cost-effective and continuous access to large volumes of court data. Given the scope of our research, frequent access to PACER imposes financial challenges. Since our work is purely for academic purposes, the exemption would allow us to focus on advancing scholarly knowledge in this area without being hindered by data access costs.
